## June Lake is Open for Winter!

JUNE LAKE, Calif., (Oct. 23, 2012) - Relaxed, affordable, incredibly scenic and nestled against the snow-blanketed backcountry of the Eastern Sierra, June Lake provides the ultimate winter destination experience for snow enthusiasts, especially families looking for a unique winter wonderland experience. Drop by the Information Kiosk at the June Lake Junction (Hwy. 158 & 395) and drive less than two miles to the welcoming June Lake village. Enjoy a stay filled with outdoor recreational pursuits - cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, snowmobiling, sledding and snowman building are just a few activities on the doorstep of this gorgeous Sierra mountain town, known as the "Switzerland of California."

**Bus Transportation to Mammoth Mountain.** Close proximity to Mammoth Mountain Ski Area – less than 20 miles away – affords guests staying in June Lake the opportunity to enjoy world-class skiing and snowboarding. Instead of dealing with the drive and parking hassles, June Lake visitors are also welcome to take the free, regularly-scheduled bus to Mammoth which will drop them off at a convenient location to Mammoth Mountain lifts.

**Winter Wonderland Village.** The charming shops, restaurants, hotels and cabins, located along June Lake's Main Street will be lit up

with sparkling twinkle lights this winter. Patti Heinrich, an active leader in the June Lake community effort says, "We are creating a winter wonderland for families and people who may not have experienced the beauty of a classic winter vacation. For example, guests and locals alike will be invited to build snowmen, snow-women, and snow-kids to help us create the Eastern Sierra's first and only Snowman Camp!" There are plans for live music on Saturday evenings and other family-fun festivities throughout the winter. Whether you are a long-time snow lover and visitor to the Eastern Sierra, or a family who has never experienced the majestic snow country, you'll find that June Lake Village is just like a scene right out of a storybook winter.

The intimate mountain village of June Lake, Calif. is located in the Eastern Sierra approximately 310 miles from Los Angeles.

From the San Francisco Bay Area, June Lake is about 360 miles on Highways 80 and 50 to US 395 in the winter. Nestled below towering granite mountain peaks and situated along the well-maintained June Lake Loop/Highway 158, June Lake is well deserving of its nickname, the Switzerland of California. Endless winter activities in this peaceful, pristine retreat are available, including skiing and snowboarding at nearby Mammoth Mountain, snowmobiling, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, and just good old-fashioned fun in the snow like sledding or building snowmen to add to the Snowman Camp population! Just 20 minutes north of Mammoth Lakes, numerous lodging properties, restaurants, shops, and four gorgeous lakes combine with majestic alpine scenery to make June Lake a magical winter retreat and, quite simply, a deeper mountain experience.
